InPlaLabs aspires to develop a Transnational Network of multistakeholder Integrated Planning Labs for knowledge co-creation on climate-resilient planning.

It envisions to influence higher education ecosystem towards integrated planning by approaching integration under a comprehensive 3-fold framework:

Discipline-based integration

Highlighting the complementary value of different disciplines relevant to sustainable planning (urbanism, mobility, transport planning, participatory planning, evidence-based planning, urban analytics, social sciences etc)

Method-based integration

Initiating the dialogue among different approaches and schools of thought involved in planning (quantitative approaches, qualitative approaches, participatory approaches)

Role-based integration

Including the different city-panning knowledge actors (urban education and research, urban practice, urban policy) and the different experiences they provide, as crucial input for creating knowledge towards integrated planning.

InPlaLabs envisions becoming a leading network of (diverse) labs that pioneers integrated urban planning methods and drives the global agenda for climate-resilient and vibrant cities.



It endeavours to advance HEd ecosystem knowledge for promoting truly integrated planning. Actually, this planning concept embraces integration based on combining disciplines, roles and approaches (qualitative, quantitative and participatory).


